As we noted in our letter dated November 4, 2020, we are processing your request for material under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The Department has identified an additional 12 responsive records subject to the FOIA. We have determined the 12 records may be released in part.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made redactions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released and is enclosed.



Lutsenko's request to meet one on one after I'd SMSed him regarding stories that he was using a third party lobbyist to pull together a planned trip to DC turned into a chat over thai food at the DCR.

We talked thru options of trip planning for his notional Aug 25-27 visit. He confirmed he had been pitched by Blue Star, not sought them out. He said he honestly didn't know how Blue Star was to get paid - he didn't have funds - and that some BPP MP that we probably didn't know "and that's good" (b)(5); (b)(6) ??) had introduced them to him. Blue Star CEO Tramontano's pitch was that she could gain him access to high levels of the Clinton campaign (GPK note: she was Podesta's deputy as deputy COS the last year of Bill Clinton's tenure), and that was appealing- to meet the possible next Presidential Chief of Staff.

But I pointed out that wasn't too likely 6 weeks before the election, and that the embassies could arrange meetings at DOJ and State, and the Ukr embassy on the Hill. As

for the Hill, not many members would be around 6 weeks before an election when Congress would be in recess, and the attention of the chattering think tank class would be on UNGA. Not the best timing, apart from DOJ and State.

In connection to Blue Star, I noted their representation of Burisma/Zlochevsky, mentioned the various money flows from Ukraine to lobbyists that had been prominently in the news this past month, whether Manafort/Klueyev via Brussels to Podesta Group and Weber/Mercury, Yanu's Justice Minister Lavrynovych to Skaden/arps-and Greg Craid--and Pinchuk to Clinton Foundation, and the media attention being paid at present to the Kyiv/Washington lobbyist gravy train....

...and he got the drift. Not ideal timing, little receptive audience, and wrong facilitator. He said he'd figure out a better time when there would be more traction/better audience.

Rest of conversation went over more regular Ukr ground. He did--you'll be pleased to learn since I have to walk back my previous strong position - indicate that there were indeed some issues regarding black of legal education degrees. hoped could be an effective bridge to NGOs via the advisory council, but that had not happened yet black odd not see the young investigator black or successful as hoped. investigations division.







Dear Colleagues,

For your kind consideration, I would like to suggest the following declaration by the G 7-Ambassadors:

"We welcome Ukraine's efforts and achievements in creating a comprehensive system aimed at preventing and fighting corruption. Over the past two years, Ukraine has set up several key anticorruption bodies such as the National Anti-Corruption Bureau (NABU) or the Specialized Anti-Corruption Prosecutor's Office (SAPO); the recent establishment of the National Agency for the Prevention of Corruption and the launch of the electronic asset declaration are of similar importance.



Several legislative initiatives that have been made public over the past weeks, however, put this anti-corruption system in jeopardy. We view with particular concern draft bills which would weaken the electronic asset declaration and curtail NABU's and SAPO's competences in investigating and prosecuting high-level corruption cases. In fact, rather than limiting specialized anti-corruption bodies' authority, those institutions should be ensured adequate means and resources, such as independent wire-tapping.

On a more general note, we note with concern recurrent efforts to introduce amendments to reform bills only passed recently, aiming at walking back reform steps just taken. Such initiatives contribute to undermining international confidence."

Dear President Poroshenko,

I am writing to express our deep concern over the Prosecutor General's proposed draft law which would eliminate NABU's exclusive jurisdiction over high-level public sector corruption cases. This draft legislation would appear to threaten NABU's independence, remove key powers, and render it incapable of successfully pursuing its anti-corruption mission.

We understand that the new draft law would not only grant the Prosecutor General's Office the authority to decide whether or not NABU can investigate cases in which it has overlapping jurisdiction with the PGO, but would also:

- Compel NABU to notify the PGO about any international requests;
- Eliminate the three day time frame for the PGO to provide international investigative documents to NABU;
- Limit NABU's competence by, for example, eliminating its ability to establish Joint Investigative Teams; and
- Generally expand the powers and authorities of the PGO.

You successfully established NABU in the wake of the EuroMaidan revolution with a unique jurisdiction and guaranteed independence. This was a signature achievement by your administration, and the international community applauded your efforts to respond to the scale and scope of corruption among Ukrainian criminal justice institutions and throughout the public sector. Since its founding, NABU has made increasing progress in its cases. We, along with civil society, the Rada, and the European Union, have made significant financial and human investments in NABU to support its independence and vital mission. Those achievements now appear to be under threat.

We ask you to use your influence to have this proposed legislation withdrawn, and publicly underscore your support for

NABU's independence, anti-corruption mission, and exclusive jurisdiction over high-level public sector corruption cases.

## Dear President Poroshenko,

I am writing to express my deep concern over the Prosecutor General's proposed draft law which would eliminate NABU's exclusive jurisdiction over high-level public sector corruption cases. This draft legislation would appear to threaten both NABU's independence and the principles in the legislation that created NABU, which the United States and other donors strongly supported in partnership with you, the Verkhovna Rada, and the people of Ukraine.

NABU was established in the wake of the EuroMaidan revolution with a unique jurisdiction and guaranteed independence. This was done in response to the scale and scope of corruption among Ukrainian criminal justice institutions and throughout the public sector. Since its founding, NABU has made increasing progress in its cases. We, along with civil society, the Rada, and the European Union, have made significant financial and human investments in NABU to support its independence and vital mission.

We understand that the new draft law would not only grant the Prosecutor General's Office the authority to decide which cases NABU would investigate, but would also:

- Compel NABU to notify the PGO about any international requests;
- Eliminate the three day time frame for the PGO to provide investigative documents to the Special Anti-Corruption Prosecutor's Office;
- Limit NABU's competence by, for example, eliminating its ability to establish Joint Investigative Teams; and
- Generally expand the powers and authorities of the PGO.



Together with RPR anticorruption experts, we would like to inform you about recent worrying attempts of Ukrainian ruling political elite to backslide anticorruption reform. It seems that presidential political group is seriously preparing to water down legislation on e-declarations and National Anticorruption Bureau, which will most likely be supported by the Narodnyi Front.

First, the President of Ukraine made a decision to limit public access to information from e-declarations of public officials. Draft law of this nature was yesterday registered in the parliament (draft #5192) by the head of presidential faction - its full text should become available online only on Tuesday. The draft law is aimed to close public access to information on cash savings, expensive gifts, expensive movable property and expenditures. Gifts and cash are the most convenient way for corrupt officials in Ukraine to receive and stow illegal assets. Moreover, access to this information will not be public anymore even through information requests, since information will be classified.

There are high chances that the president will try to push this draft law through the parliament already next week (on October 4 or 6) - most likely violating the Rules of Procedure.

Second, the Prosecutor General of Ukraine Yuriy Lutsenko announced that exclusive jurisdiction of NABU over high profile corruption related crimes must be changed. We have information that the draft law on this issue will appear in the parliament early next week. The draft law will change NABU's jurisdiction: instead of exclusive jurisdiction of the Bureau, it will give all law enforcement bodies the right to investigate cases of grand corruption and it will introduce the right for the Prosecutor General to decide which body should investigate this or that case. These provisions undermine the very idea of special institution for independent investigation of high profile corruption. Politically dependent Prosecutor General will receive powers to protect anyone from being brought to justice. Once again, the president and his faction will try to make the parliament adopt this draft law in full next week (October 4 or 6).

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We are afraid, that political elite of Ukraine once received IMF funds and loan guarantees, decided to "forget" about key anti-corruption commitments and requirements of our Western partners.

We kindly ask you, should you have an opportunity, to remind our president that rollback of anticorruption reform is unacceptable. Any public statement before Tuesday (even a notification on facebook or twitter) from your side on the issue would help us to protect anti-corruption reform from serious steps back during upcoming days.


